<b>GCSE English Language</b>	<p><b>GCSE English</b> is a core subject and is taken by those learners who have previously gained grade 3, or those learners who have achieved Functional Skills Level 2 English whilst studying in Post 16. GCSE emphasises the quality and accuracy of writing and core writing skills, such as spelling, punctuation and grammar. This allows learners to demonstrate their ability in functional English. This also offers opportunities to investigate and analyse language, experiment and use language creatively.</p> <p><b>At Entry Level 1 to Level 2 Edexcel Functional Skills English</b> helps learners to build basic and relevant literacy skills and is suitable for learners in Key Stage 5.</p>
